WESTERN WYOMING COMMUNITY COLLEGE

College classes for students 16 and over in RHS or COOP high schools are free. The tuition (cost of the class) fees (internet or lab costs) and books are all paid for by CCHEC.

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT: These college classes are taught by a college approved high school teacher during the high school day. For example: Construction with Mr. Miller or Welding with Mr. Edwards.

DUAL ENROLLMENT: Students take onsite and online classes directly from WWCC at CCHEC, often times during the school day. For example: General Psychology, PSYC 1000 or English Composition, ENGL 1010.

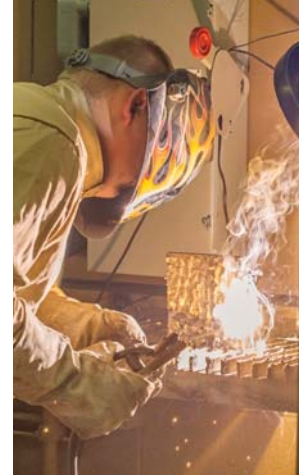
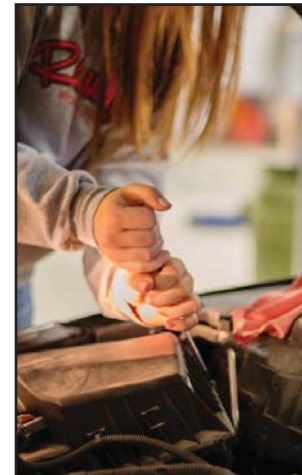

DO I GET HIGH SCHOOL AND/OR COLLEGE CREDIT?
